LAST SUNDAY IN ROME the Holy Father canonized St. John Henry Newman (1801 – 1890). Born in England, John Henry Newman was first an Anglican priest, theologian and poet, who later came into full communion with the Roman Catholic Church in 1845, was ordained as a catholic priest in 1846 and was later named a cardinal. DID YOU KNOW . . . EDUCATION IN THE PIONEER SETTLEMENT: In 1902 residents of Barry's bay got their first separate school built within the village. The secretary/treasurer of the school board was postmaster William Kirwin. The one-room board and batten frame schoolhouse was built on the southeast corner of Conway Street and Opeongo line (today a private residence). In 1903 Rev. Narcisse Zephirin Lorrain Bishop of Pembroke arrived in Barry's Bay by railway hand car from Killaloe to bless the newly constructed school, known as Barry's Bay Separate School, (S.S. #6 Sherwood Separate). The school closed in 1915 and students were transferred to the newly built school on the Beer store site. Reportedly the schoolhouse later burned while being rented as a private residence.
