DID YOU KNOW . . . DEVELOPMENT OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRY'S BAY: Another account claims that Barry's Bay developed on a small plain after a forest fire passed through the town site in the early 1800s. As a result, the site became overgrown with large patches of blueberries. The bay was referred to as "Blueberry Bay", and soon the local people began calling the area "Berries Bay". Over time the name changed to "Barry's Bay". The true origin of the Barry's Bay name seems to have been lost in time, and to date there is no clear evidence on how the town got its name. Perhaps, a bit of each legend contributes to the story that resulted in the name designation for the village.

ST HUBERT – Born in the 7th century, St. Hubert liked to skip Mass on Sundays to go hunting. He was obsessed with the hunt so much so that he even went out on Good Friday to bag himself a deer. While everyone else was at church for the Good Friday service, Hubert was out pursuing an amazing stag. He was about to kill the deer when the animal abruptly turned around and looked right at Hubert. Between the stag's antlers was a glowing crucifix, and a voice from heaven called out to him, "Hubert, unless you turn to the Lord, and lead a holy life, you shall quickly go down to hell." Afterwards Hubert sought the instruction of the local bishop and began a new chapter in his life. Among other activities, Hubert became a strong promoter of ethical hunting practices and urged hunters to treat animals with respect, avoiding any kind of cruelty. He was a holy man, renowned for his preaching and his new pursuit as a "hunter of souls." His association with hunting led the Church to name Hubert patron saint of furriers and trappers, hunters, hunting and hunting dogs.
