Our diocese faces many new challenges due to the lack of vocations and at times resources to adequately respond to the spiritual needs of Catholics during Covid-19. Sometimes we forget that there are places in the world where the Catholic Faith is growing rapidly and lack the resources and infrastructure that we enjoy.

At one time missionary vocations (Sisters of St. Joseph, Grey Sisters and Oblates, Madonna House) from our diocese went to serve in many places around the world such as Peru, Japan, China, Africa and the Dominican Republic. There are communities that still have direct and indirect ministry presence.

Now our diocese is blessed with priests from Africa and Poland who ensure our own parishes are served. Even within Canada we have dioceses that are in need of spiritual temporal assistance. The Diocese of Pembroke has entered into partnership with the Archdiocese of Keewatin-Le Pas, which is a territory of over 430,000 square kilometers (that is larger than Greenland) spanning across Northern Manitoba and Saskatchewan. This Archdiocese has only 14 priests. When we think of Barry's Bay (and the close proximity of Wilno, Killaloe, Combermere, Round Lake and Whitney), we may well appreciate our many opportunities to celebrate the sacraments.

While it is always beneficial to encourage distant places, it begins with our own positive faith response.
