Holy Year of St. Joseph – The holy example of Jesus Christ who, while upon earth, honoured St. Joseph so highly and was obedient to him during his life should be sufficient to inflame the hearts of all with devotion to the saint

REGINA COELI – The Easter prayer Regina Coeli (“Queen of Heaven” in Latin) is a wonderful tribute to our Lord’s resurrection and to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although its origins are unknown, it dates back to the 13th century.

The Regina Coeli is one of four antiphons (short liturgical texts sung or chanted, dedicated to Our Lady. It is often sung as a hymn and has had numerous musical settings in its original Latin text, including several by Mozart.

Traditionally, it is prayed standing, often at noon, in place of another well-known prayer, the Angelus, during the Easter season from Holy Saturday until Pentecost.

Queen of Heaven, rejoice. Alleluia.

For He, whom thou wast worthy to bear. Alleluia.

Has risen as He said. Alleluia.

Pray for us to God. Alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary. Alleluia.

R. Because the Lord is truly risen, Alleluia.

What shall I return to the LORD for all his bounty to me . . . ?
I will pay my vows to the LORD in the presence of all his people.

We dream of a solution to the problems challenging society – but living in hope compels us to volunteer, to study the issues, to actually be part of the solution. We imagine a more unified, less divisive world – but living in hope is to act with kindness and understanding, to be the means of reconciliation and peace within our own families, communities and churches. We wish to be spared the virus – but living in hope is to understand the need to wear a face mask, keep our distance, offer our help to the sick and suffering, trusting that our sacrifice will bring health and healing. Yes, we can wish and dream and imagine – and remain stuck in our Good Friday crypts. So this Easter Season, let's begin to dare to live in hope: hope that frees us from our graves of fear and anxiety that pulls us out of our graves of denial and cynicism. Let's live our lives in the hope of God's grace: that, in the Christ who "goes before" us, we can transform our Galilees into the Kingdom of God's justice and mercy.

Premier Doug Ford made the announcement on Wednesday, saying that the new measures are being taken in response to the rapid increase in COVID-19 transmission. The Stay-at-home order which by law allows people to only leave their home for essential reasons, has gone into effect as of 12:01 a.m. on April 8th. Premier Ford said, the stay-at-home order will be very similar to the one that was put into effect in January, with a few exceptions. This is the second time Ontario has been placed under a stay-at-home order. What about weddings, funerals and other religious services? Weddings, funerals and other religious services are subject to capacity limits of 15 percent indoors. In an outdoor setting, capacity limits are set at the number of people who can fit in the space and still maintain two meters of distance from each other. Guests must always maintain physical distance and wear face coverings.
