Solemn Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament on All Saints Day, Monday, November 1st. Mass will be offered at 12 noon followed by Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Diocesan Opening of the Synod – Bishop Guy Desrochers has officially open the Roman Synod in our Diocese at the Cathedral of St. Columbkille. The Church of God is convoked in Synod. With convocation, Pope Francis invites the whole Church to question herself on synodality: ad decisive theme for the life and mission of the Church.” The synod will be for two years, from 2021 until 2023. A tune if reflection and sharing of the whole Church.”

The Synod was established by Pope St. Paul VI and usually involves the Pope and bishops from the world. Its purpose is to advise and thus assist the Holy Father in his care for the church. Pope Francis wishes this synod to be different in that its consultation will be more broad, beginning in the Diocese, then continents and finally the Church Universal. The topic for the synod is “synodality” and thus it is to discuss the future of the Synod in the Church.

Road Map For the Roman Synodal Process

October, 2021

- Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops Secretariat sends a questionnaire (with numbered questions) to dioceses.
- Liturgical opening of the Synod process in each particular Church.
- Diocesan consultations may begin immediately.

February, 2022

- The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops General secretary and the Regional General secretaries prepare the introduction which will present the four regional synthesis that will be sent to Rome.

March, 2022

- Each Regional Assembly creates a regional synthesis committee (4-8 persons) which develops a “regional synthesis.”
- The introduction is submitted to the Canadian Conference of catholic Bishops bodies for approval on 24th March 2022.

1 April 2022

- Each diocese completes its diocesan synthesis and submits it to its respective Regional Assembly.

15 April 2022

- Each regional committee submits its regional synthesis to the regional bodies for approval.

22 April 2022

- Each regional committee sends its regional synthesis to the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops Secretariat. The national synthesis is then prepared.

27 April 2022

- The national synthesis, with the final regional synthesis attached, is submitted to the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops Executive Committee and Permanent Council for approval.

29 April 2022

- The final document is sent to Rome by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops Secretariat.
