# ¥ Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles ¥

June 29, 2025

Today, the Church celebrates with joy the memory of both Peter and Paul together. The "Rock" and the "Chosen instrument" finally met in Rome, fulfilling their apostolic ministry, sealing it with the effusion of blood. The mysterious journey of faith and love, which leads Peter and Paul from the land of their birth to Jerusalem, and then to other parts of the world and finally to Rome, in a certain sense is a model of the journey that every Christian is called to undertake to witness to Christ in the world.

The message that always comes to the Church from the holy Apostles Peter and Paul is clear and eloquent: by the grace of God, in every circumstance it is possible for man to become a sign of the victorious power of God. Because of this, he must not fear. Whoever has confidence in God, free from every fear, experiences the consoling presence of the Spirit also, and especially, in times of trial and suffering.

We strongly see the need of having "to begin again from Christ," the foundation of our faith and mission. "Yesterday, today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8), Christ is the solid rock on which the Church is built. Following the example of Peter and Paul and with their constant support, let us try to repeat every instant to Christ: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God! You are our only Redeemer!" ~ St. John Paul II on July 2, 2002

**CANADA DAY:** On the occasion of the **Dominion of Canada's** 158th birthday this Tuesday. July 1st, we also celebrate what makes our country feel like home and our Faith which has been profoundly integral to our Canadian creativity and heritage. A mari usque ad mare has been the official motto of the Dominion of Canada for nearly a century; it is inscribed on the Canadian coat of arms approved by King George V in 1921. The phrase comes from a verse in Psalm 72, translated as "he shall have dominion from sea to sea." This verse inspired the choice of *Dominion* as the title for Canada.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN CANADA: The life of the Catholic Church in Canada has been integral to the history of our nation and its peoples. Deep faith in God, heroic sacrifice, and an immense love for Christ witnessed by her saints, shepherds and lay faithful has helped our country be truly "glorious and free".

- 1535 Jacques Cartier arrives in Canada and erects a cross at Saint-Servan
- 1611 Samuel de Champlain founds the first Catholic colony in Quebec City
  - First Jesuits arrive in New France
- 1639 Jesuits establish St. Marie-Among-the-Hurons near Midland, Ontario
- 1649 Jean de Brebeuf and Gabriel Lalemant are martyred in Saint-Ignace II near Midland
- 1659 St. François de Laval arrives in Quebec City as its new bishop
  - St. Marguerite de Bourgeoys founds the Congregation of Notre-Dame
- 1680 St. Kateri Tekakwitha dies in Kahnawake, Quebec
- 1737 St. Marguerite d'Youville founds the Sisters of Charity of Montreal (Grey Sisters)
- 1841 Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate arrive in Montreal
- 1843 Bl. Marie-Rose Durocher founds the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary in Longueil, Quebec
- 1850 Basilian Fathers arrive in Toronto
- 1851 Mother Delphine Fontbonne and three Sisters of St. Joseph arrive in Toronto
- 1867 CONFEDERATION OF THE DOMINION OF CANADA
- \*1898 The Diocese of Pembroke is formed from the territory of the Vicariate Apostolic of Pontiac under the jurisdiction of the Diocese of Ottawa
- \*1902 Mission church -St. Francis de Sales built at Latchford Bridge
- \*1906 Mission church Sacred Heart -- built in Combermere
- 1907 Founding of St. Joseph Chapel in Montreal by Saint "Brother" André Bessette, Congregation of the Holy Cross
- \*1931 Combermere becomes a parish
- \*1946 Beginnings of what would become Madonna House Apostolate
- \*1947 Latchford Bridge becomes a parish
- \*1951 Sacred Heart Church burns to the ground
- \*1952 Holy Canadian Martyrs Church is built and dedicated in 1953
- \*1957 St. Francis de Sales reverts back to being a mission
- \*1963 St. Joseph's House (Madonna House) is established
- 1967 St. Joseph's Oratory is completed in Montreal
- 1984 Pope John Paul II's first visit to Canada
- 2002 World Youth Day-Toronto; 800K pilgrims celebrate the final Mass with Saint John Paul II
- 2022 Pope Francis comes to Canada in a "penitential pilgrimage" with the goal of contributing to the "process of healing and reconciliation with the country's Indigenous peoples"
